Mary and Joseph's Journey

When Palestine was under Roman occupation, Mary and Joseph had to travel from Nazareth to Bethlehem to be taxed.

If a modern Mary and Joseph had to make that journey today, they would travel



Around 750,000 Israelis live in settlements in the Occupied Palestinian Territories, deemed illegal under international law. A minority, including some from Yitzhar settlement, attack Palestinians and destroy their crops.

At the end of their journey, would today's Mary and Joseph get through The Wall? The Open Bethlehem organisation says: "The Wall encircles Bethlehem... with the land isolated by the Wall, annexed for settlements and closed under various pretexts, only 3% of the Bethlehem district is available for Palestinian use."

Bethlehem Now

Mary, Joseph and baby Jesus fled from the persecution of the Roman occupation and became refugees in Egypt. Some 750,000 Palestinians fled from the violence accompanying the foundation of Israel. But while the **Holy Family** eventually returned home to Nazareth, Israel denies to Palestinians the universal human right to go home, and some 7 million now live as refugees around the world.

Star Street, which may have been Mary and Joseph's route into Bethlehem. Once full of shops, it is now quiet because few tourists stay in the city.

Only about 47,000 Christians live in the Occupied Palestinian Territories today. In **Bethlehem** they have *shrunk from 85% of* the population to 12% largely because many have emigrated to

escape the harsh conditions of life under military occupation.

Aida refugee camp is one of three in Bethlehem which together house over 20,000 refugees descended from those who fled their homes in what is now Israel. The huge key represents their longing to return
