**MERTON ASYLUM SEEKERS AGM REPORT:** St. John Fishers food collection was acknowledged in this report. Also, some articles on asylum issues in the report were passed on for reprinting in our parish magazine

**ASSISTED SUICIDE BILL:** Our church petition gathered 650 signatures. Some members of our group helped in the collection of these. Julie reported on a meeting she attended at Edge Hill concerning this Bill, with speakers from different faiths. Members of the House of Lords who opposed the Bill have apparently faced much scorn from their colleagues and would benefit from some public support, Julie urged us to write to one of the Lords (Lord Alton is one of them) to express appreciation for their efforts.
