Reports:

<u>Food Collections</u> – Wimbledon Foodbank were again very grateful for this month's collection. Next month we collect again for Faith in Action. After each Mass if members present put donations in the confessional, they can be left there till Wednesday morning. In December we will collect for the Christian Care Christmas hampers. Assuming the exercise class is still in the hall on Monday morning, the food will have to be stored in the bar till Tuesday. We will then make up the hampers after our meeting on 10th December. They may then need to be stored at Julie or Christine's.

<u>Fairtrade Sale</u> – although the number of people who came into the hall was relatively small, those who did spent and donated generously. We took £373, with a profit for Christian Care of almost £34. Many thanks were expressed to Christine for all her work making this happen.
